Nomination and Selection Criteria

- The nominee consistently performs above and beyond his or her job description/ requirements to serve the children and families of Pinellas County.
- The nominee is an inspiration to co-workers and to children and families they serve.
- The nominee's efforts have helped improve the condition of a group or individual.
- The nominee is an employee in good standing with a Pinellas County agency.
- The nominee's primary duties are to provide direct services to children and/or families; the nominee <u>DOES NOT</u> supervise, manage, direct, or oversee a program.
- Classroom teachers above the pre-kindergarten level are not eligible. However, other public/private school employees, such as school social workers, are eligible.
- The nominee may not be an employee or family member of the Juvenile Welfare Board.
